## Course Content

Reverse logistics is important because it maintains an efficient flow of goods. The process reduces costs, creates value, decreases risk and completes the product life cycle.

Gartner Research says that about 70% of businesses plan to invest in the "circular economy." This circular economy follows traditional logistics and then continues around through what Gartner calls a closed-loop supply chain.

The purpose of this course is to develop employees awareness of the impact of dealing with returns effectively and the cost and environmental impact involved.

At the end of each course, participants will have developed an understanding of:

- Principles of the 5 Rs of reverse logistics
- Understanding returns policies and customer rights
- Remanufacturing or refurbishment options
- Solutions for end of life products
- · Benefits of reverse logistics
- Challenges of reverse logistics
- Measuring the impact
